August Travel Recap: *Thirty-three TIAA Travelers had a great time visiting the Air Tractor manufacturing company in Olney, TX, on August 17. We took a luxury bus to Jacksboro stopping to eat at the Green Frog, and then a 30-minute drive delivered us to the large plant where we toured two of the four hangers. They were building several models of planes during our tour that are used for seeding, spraying, spying and fighting fires – imagine, flying tractors. The owner of this company sold it to the employees before he died at 80 so they cannot be bought out by another company and can stay in Olney. The 250 employees continue to build approximately 125 to 135 planes a year which are delivered to as far away as Australia while their closest competitor builds about 25. An educational and very interesting tour.*



Our second trip of the month was to the Dallas Emergency Response Center in Dallas City Hall via a DART bus on August 25. There were 23 of us who descended to the sub-basement of the Dallas City Hall to experience a private tour by one of Dallas' Certified Emergency Manager Specialists. Whether it's a tornado, flood, dam breakage, hazardous incident, terrorist activity or pandemic, the city has a plan and is prepared to act. Affected specialties (Police, Fire Department, Weather, Finances) meet in this huge conference room with large computer screens on the walls to handle the crisis. August CIT Recap: Four TIAA volunteers boarded The Senior Source van on Monday, August 1, to assist the Wilkinson Center during their annual shoe drive for disadvantaged children needing shoes as they return to school. The Wilkinson Center is a dynamic service provider for families struggling to escape poverty, providing services throughout nine zip codes in East and Southeast Dallas including Pleasant Grove. Arriving at the Payless Shoe Store and were immediately put to work fitting shoes for the children. A volunteer measured the child's foot size then found a pair of new shoes for them with their Mom's approval. Thanks to Wilkinson Center's generous support of the program, each child received a new pair of shoes for free. The Wilkinson Center reports that over a 20-hour period on Sunday and Monday, a total of 1,451 children received new shoes and socks to start the new school year. We were blessed to see a huge smile on the face of each child as they headed home. The smiles alone were worth all the work we did as volunteers and we left energized to schedule a return trip next year.

September 13, Medical Reserve Corps – Tuesday, 8:30 am - 1:30 pm. The Dallas County Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) provides supplemental support to a variety of local public health initiatives such as school, civic, and faith-based sponsored health fairs, back-up support of immunization clinics and vaccination campaigns, epidemiology staff support during disease outbreaks, and community-wide public health education campaigns. They recruit and train local volunteers to supplement medical response to local disasters and other public health emergencies. We'll board the Senior Source bus at Texins Activity Center at 8:30 am. Volunteers will assemble emergency response bags or other needed activities relating to emergency preparedness. Afterwards, we will have lunch at a local restaurant (at our own expense) and return to the Texins Activity Center about 1:30 pm. October 5, Crossroads Community Services – Wednesday, 8:30 am – 1:30 pm. Crossroads has two primary goals: 1) To help ensure that all people in Dallas County have ready access to nourishing foods; 2) To provide life-skills education that can help reduce obesity in impoverished areas. We will board a Senior Source bus at 8:30 am. Volunteers will assist Crossroads neighbors in selecting grocery items and/or helping in the clothing distribution area. Afterwards, we will have lunch at a local restaurant (at our own expense) and arrive back to the Texins Activity Center about 1:30 pm. Reminder: Flu shots will be available for TI Retirees at CR4 in the North Central Expressway Texins Association on September 29 from 7:00 am to 2:00 pm and on September 30 from noon to 7:00 pm. There will also be an opportunity to receive flu shots at the TI Retiree Luncheon on November 3. If you are covered by Medicare Part B, please bring your Medicare card for a free flu shot. If you are not covered by Medicare Part B, you will need to pay \$24 for the shot (cash or check) at the event. Please be aware that these flu shots are the Trivalent (3 strains) variety, not the Senior Citizen beefed-up shot usually called a High Dose.
