TI Retiree Luncheon Set for November 9 at Mesquite Convention Center

This year the TI retiree luncheon will feature a wonderful panel of TI engineers from the TI New Employee Initiative (NEI)! The panel will share insights about their careers, new technologies and product innovations that will shape the future of TI. The “Next Generation of TI Innovation” event will be hosted by Jared Miller, product development engineer and chair of the TI NEI. After the innovation panel, there will be a brief update on TI’s recent financial results. We will then be entertained by Marty Ruiz and the Spectacular Senior Follies. A special feature this year will



be a team from the DeGolyer Library at Southern Methodist University (SMU), who will set up an exhibit of artifacts from TI’s archives at the SMU Library. The team is digitizing some of TI’s rare photos and will demonstrate how to access these on the Internet. In addition to explaining how they are preserving the TI Archives, they want to hear stories from retirees who worked on some of the former products and businesses at TI. Invitations have been mailed with instructions on how to register for this event.

TIAA Golf Tournament Raises More Than \$22,000

On a bright and cool day when comments such as awesome and perfect were used to describe the weather, some 86 golfers teed off for the 18th Annual TIAA Charity Golf Tournament at the

TIAA Health Benefit Seminar



More than 650 retirees attended the two health benefits sessions at the Plano Event Center on Thursday, October 26. About 80 were in attendance for the morning session, which was geared to Pre-Medicare retirees, and more than 570 were there for the Medicare-Eligible presentation. Lisa Calloway, TIAA Vice President for Education, pointed out how important it is for retirees to update their addresses when they moved. She commented that changes could be telephoned to Fidelity at 888-660-1411 and that they, in turn, would notify TI and One Exchange of the changes. She also asked that all TIAA members update any address changes either on the TIAA website or by phoning our office at 214-567-8444. In addition to information about health insurance, which is summarized in the slide presentations, TI Consulting Medical Director, Dr. Kevin Soden, gave some practical advice to retirees about health care and supplements.

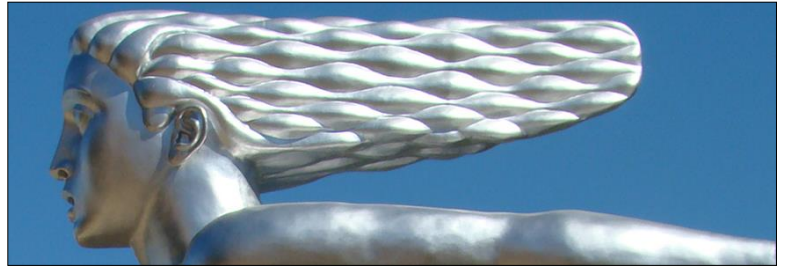
TIAA Travel Events

Meyerson Symphony Center on the evening of October 7. During the reception, a photographer was available to take family pictures while enjoying delicious desserts, drinks and music played by the DSO Youth Strings. The 90-minute concert was outstanding with familiar, classical music being well performed in this outstanding venue. TIAA thanks Texas Instruments for including our retirees in this event.

November 15, Fair Park Tram Tour – 9:00 am to 2:00 pm, Wednesday. We will have a guided tour from a motorized, covered tram (weather permitting) and learn about the grand history of this 277-acre premier park from our guide, Craig Holcomb, President of Friends of Fair Park. Several structures



made their debut on the grounds between 1900 and 1930 but it became nationally known in 1935 when it hosted the world's fair commemorating the 100th anniversary of the Texas Republic. It was designed in the Art Deco style and now stands as the only intact and unaltered pre-1950s world fair site in the US. See and hear about the legendary murals of the Centennial and Automobile buildings. After the tour we will lunch at Matt's El Rancho on our own. We'll board the bus at Texins at 9:00 am. Cost is \$15 for members and \$17 for nonmembers.

December 7, Enchant Christmas – 4:00 pm to 9:00 pm, Thursday. Experience some Christmas wonder at Enchant, the world's largest Christmas light maze and market at Globe Life Park in Arlington.
