January 11, Crossroads Community Services – Thursday 8:30 am. One of Crossroads' primary goals is to ensure that all people in Dallas County have ready access to nourishing foods. Another primary goal is to provide life skills education that can help clients accomplish goals that are important to them. Crossroads provides clothing to in-house pantry clients as well as clients from The Stewpot. Crossroads partners with educational and medical institutions in Dallas County to seek more holistic solutions to deeply entrenched social and economic problems. Volunteers will assist Crossroads "neighbors" in selecting grocery items and/or helping in the clothing distribution area. January 17, Federal Reserve Bank – Wednesday, 9:15 am. As one of twelve regional Reserve Banks in the Federal Reserve System, the Dallas Fed serves the Eleventh Federal Reserve District which consists of Texas, northern Louisiana and southern New Mexico. Prior to our private, guided tour all guests will be required to present a valid government-issued photo ID. (For international guests, a valid passport must be presented.) Children are not required to present identification but must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. Guests will undergo security screening upon arrival. Weapons of any kind (including pocket knives) are prohibited on Bank premises. We will leave Texins Activity Center at 9:15 am, take the 10:00 am tour followed by a visit to their art gallery (it currently contains over 100 paintings, sculptures, prints and photographs by living artists who work in the 11th Federal Reserve District.) We will eat lunch at Cheddars (so bring money). We will return around 2:30 pm. Cost is \$12 for members and \$14 for nonmembers.
