Community Involvement Events

February & March Community Involvement Recap: On February 13 several of us went to play Bingo with the residents of Crystal Creek Retirement home located near the TI main campus. We

enjoyed calling Bingo numbers to a large crowd of residents and helping them fill in their cards. Great fun for all and all the residents won a prize.

On February 22, we went to the Senior Source and two volunteers conducted “Mock Interviews” with four seniors who were re-entering the work force and needed help in writing a resume and conducting an effective job interview. By listening and critiquing, we were able to help them improve their interview skills. Seven other volunteers stuffed clear envelopes with safety awareness and emergency response literature brochures for the Medical Reserve Corp of Dallas County. The Medical Reserve Corp’s community outreach program emphasizes the importance of being prepared for catastrophic local disasters or other public health emergencies and the packets we prepared will be provided to the MRC’s clients.

On March 13, six TIAA members arrived at the Family Place Retail Shop on Forrest Land to spend the morning sorting incoming donations and preparing item for sale. We were able to sort hundreds of ladies’ clothing onto sales racks and also labeled a huge inventory of costume jewelry for sale. The family Place Resale Shop serves a vital role for their clients who often give up everything to flee from domestic violence. Their clients are provided with vouchers to purchase whatever they need to start new lives

April 12, CitySquare Opportunity Center – Thursday, 8:30 am - 1:30 pm. The CitySquare Food Pantry provides food to thousands of low-income working families in Dallas each year and serves as an oasis of healthy food in the South Dallas food desert. CitySquare also fights childhood hunger through its afterschool and summer meal programs. The summer meal program, Food on the Move, fights childhood hunger statewide by deploying CitySquare AmeriCorps members to deliver meals and provide enrichment activities to thousands of children residing in apartment communities. Please join us at the Texins Activity Center to board a Senior Source bus at 8:30 am. Volunteers will assist CitySquare’s neighbors with shopping, restocking the pantry shelves, and by sorting inventory and food donations. Afterwards, we will have lunch at a local restaurant (at our own expense) and arrive back to the Texins Activity Center around 1:30 pm.

April 24, Texas Ramp Project – Tuesday, 8:30 am The Texas Ramp Project changes people’s lives in a single hundreds of times a year! They build wheelchair ramps for disabled or elderly people who can’t afford to buy one. In a few hours in a morning, they give these folks the freedom to leave their home again – the home where they want to remain but whose steps have imprisoned them. Please meet by 8:30 am at an assigned location by private vehicle. A Senior Source van will not be available for this event’s transportation. Volunteers will assist in the construction of a custom-made ramp; no construction skills required! Afterwards, we will have lunch at a local restaurant (at our own expense). Please **register** early so we have a count to determine which ramp(s) will be built and to provide you with the address.

May 14, Network of Community Ministries – Monday, 9:30 am -1:30 pm. We will meet at 741 South Sherman St (one mile north of TI Expressway site). Volunteers will stock food shelves with canned and dry goods obtained from the US Postal Service’s food-donation collection scheduled each year in mid-May. Afterwards, we will have lunch at a local restaurant (at our own expense).
