Summer Seminars – Just for the Fun of It

Register now for the second in a series of three fun Summer Seminars. All are held in CR1/CR2 in the cool Texins Activity Center, with refreshments provided. The second seminar, “TI Retiree Author’s Workshop”, on **Wednesday, July 20, (1-3:30 pm)** will focus on the art of the written word. Two accomplished TI-retiree authors will be on hand to review their publications. Ed Millis will tell about his research on the life of Jack Kilby, which resulted in the first full-length biography on the inventor of the integrated circuit: *Jack St. Clair Kilby: A Man of Few Words*. Ed will also discuss how to write your own life story, and will provide a two-page handout with details on to get started. Harvey Cragon will speak about his research and writing of three books on World War II computing: a vacuum tube digital computer built in England to break the German Fish cipher, two electromechanical analog computers; the US submarine torpedo data computer and the Norden bombsight. In addition, he will discuss writing two booklets: one on the British Royal Navy’s codes and ciphers used in the Napoleonic Wars and the second on a late 19th century railroad in northwest Arkansas.

Following the presentations, a Q&A session will be held on the “how to” of researching and publishing a book. Please register by July 18 so we can plan for refreshments.
