February 10, Witherspoon Distillery – 11:00 am to 4:00 pm, Friday, Lewisville. Distilling is a labor of love and during the tour you will learn the history of distilling, their history as a distillery and



the processes they use to produce spirits. This business is ranked #1 on the list of 29 things to do in Lewisville and the education on distilling is worth the time! We will hop on a bus at 11:00 am, have lunch and take the 1:00 pm guided tour which lasts approximately 60 minutes, followed immediately by a full tasting of their products (rum and whiskey). Please bring valid, government-

issued ID as all attendees must be at least 21. At the end of the tasting, guests may purchase products and merchandise at the distillery (rum cake, anyone?) 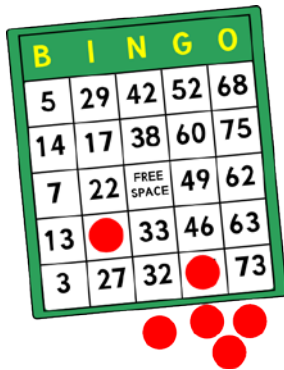

White Rock Center of Hope provides emergency aid to neighbors in the forms of food pantry, clothing, transportation, financial assistance, etc. It is supported by contributions of individuals, organizations and area churches. Please join us at the Texins Activity Center to board a Senior Source bus at 8:30 am. Volunteers will work in the food pantry area filling food bags to be ready for distribution as well as perform other pantry duties or assist in the clothing distribution area as needed. Afterwards, we will have lunch at a local restaurant (at our own expense) and

arrive back to the Texins Activity Center around 1:30 pm. Please log on and [register](#) for this event.

February 13, Crossroads Community Services, – 8:30 am to 1:30 pm, Monday. Crossroads has two primary goals: 1) To help ensure that all people in Dallas County have ready access to nourishing foods; 2) To provide life-skills education that can help reduce obesity in impoverished areas.
