March Community Involvement Recap: Tuesday morning, March 12, nine TIAA volunteers gathered together at the Dallas SPCA center located on I-35 west of downtown. We toured the large, modern facility both indoors and outdoors – even though it was a cool, rainy day. Inside, there were dozens of cages for both dogs and cats – and even a few small mice! The SPCA has a surgery ward and we watched as a veterinarian and his assistants treated six dogs who were not too pleased with their day in the clinic. The animals loved us as we walked by their cage and wagged their tails (or purred) furiously. They all wanted to be adopted. After the tour, we went into a conference room where tables were filled with items to create “pup-cicles”. We mashed together enough dry dog food and canned dog food to fill a paper cup. These cups were then placed in a freezer to give to dogs later during the week. All in all, we were proud of our accomplishment and felt warmed by our tour of the adorable pets.



April 9, Crossroads Community Services – Tuesday, 8:30 am – 1:30 pm. Crossroads Community Services moved from their former location on Young Street to the Pollock Campus off Cockrell Hill Road, former location of the North Texas Food Bank (NTFB). They are serving as the southern regional hub for NTFB and expanding their food distribution program. In 2018, Crossroads distributed approximately 2.25 million pounds of food, and in 2019 plan to distribute about three times that amount this year. They will be distributing food to approximately 100 organizations who will use it to nourish families in their communities including, for the first time, Ellis and Navarro counties. Their new location is almost fifteen times larger than the old space. Please join us at the Texins Fitness Center to board a Senior Source bus at 8:30 am. TIAA Volunteers will assist Crossroads neighbors in selecting grocery items and/or helping in the clothing distribution area. Afterwards, we will have lunch at a local restaurant (at our own expense) and arrive back to the Texins Fitness Center by 1:30 pm. March Travel and Events Recap: On March 16, some of us met at the Dos Banderas restaurant in Garland for dinner and then walked over to the Granville Arts Center to watch a comedy called "The Foreigner". Many of the old buildings have been converted to residential use. The tour guide ended the two-hour tour where it began, the Main Street Garden and our bus driver

transported us back to One Main Place where we entered the Dallas underground mall. All of us ate in the food court, picking out the type of menu we liked; and, after lunch, some of us attempted to explore the tunnels. Near the food court there are a few shops, but beyond these the tunnels were like hallways that went toward the lower level of office buildings or to elevators/escalators to the surface.

April 4, Trinity River Audubon Center – Thursday, 10:00 am – 2:00 pm. Connect with nature and experience the outdoors with your TIAA friends as we take a guided tour of the beautiful Trinity River Audubon Center in Dallas. It may just be thirty minutes away from TI, but you'll feel a world away while we are there. It is in the 6,000-acre Great Trinity Forest, which is the largest urban hardwood forest in America and it contains a unique mixture of bottom-land hardwoods, wetland systems and grasslands. We will leave at 10:00 am, enjoy a 60-minute guided tour at the Center. Weather permitting, we will can walk one or two of the hiking trails (some are handicapped-accessible); eat at Chili's Bar & Grill (on our own); and return about 2:00 pm. Cost is \$10 for members and \$12 for nonmembers. Please [register online](#) early as the tours are limited to 20 people.



April 16, In-Sync Exotics, Wylie – Tuesday, 9:30 am – 2:00 pm. Join us for a private tour of a wonderful, non-profit facility that accepts large cats from neglected, abused and unwanted conditions. The stories of each cat are posted on the cages so that you can learn about the tigers, lions, cougars, leopards, cheetahs, bobcats, lynx, servals and ocelots that call In-Sync home. They neither buy, sell, trade nor breed these animals; but, instead, provide them with a safe, loving, nurturing home for the remainder of their lives. Each volunteer has a favorite cat and you will be impressed

with the love and care that is evident throughout this incredible sanctuary. Wear comfortable shoes as this is a 90-minute tour and they have asked if we would please bring rolls of paper towels as well. We will leave at 9:30 am, take the tour, enjoy lunch at our own expense at a restaurant near Wylie and return about 2 pm. Cost is \$14 for members and \$16 for nonmembers.
